A. Reorganization

Our projected registrations were 143. The first week of school we were up to 174 and have settled today at 161. The board has been very supportive and given us a new classroom taking us from 7 classes to 8. As we need a portable to do this, there are many pieces that need to come together before classes will be rearranged. Parents will be notified be their child's teacher of any changes. Grades 4, 5 and 6 classes will be in the portables and the library will move back into the school to accommodate a child who is in a wheelchair.

Staffing changes include:

- 5. Starting October 20, Rebecca Soden, in a long-term maternity leave for Victoria Wasson, grade 1.
- 6. New hire starting in our new grade 1/2 class as soon as furniture has been secured. We are targeting mid to end of next week.

I have bought licenses for Raz Kids (language program) and IIXL math for each child attending Buckhorn. Accessing and utilizing these programs will be explicitly taught to each child and made available for use at school and home. It is one way we look to strengthen the home-school connection.
